THE NATIONAL YOUTH CHOIR

The National Youth Choir is a special project of the Association of Canadian Choral Conductors in co-operation with the provincial choral organizations. The project, now in its third phase, is funded in part by grants from the federal government, Department of Communications Cultural Initiatives Program, the Canada Council, the provincial choral organizations and the private sector. In addition, each participant is required to pay a modest tuition fee.


Initiated in 1984 the project was designed to parallel the training offered to young instrumentalists by the well established National Youth Orchestra. Like the NYO, the National Youth Choir provides a musical and educational experience for the participants. It helps to promote the performance of quality choral music and the exchange of musical expertise, repertoire and techniques, while at the same time encouraging understanding and good will by bringing together singers from across the country. Perhaps even more importantly, the NYC facilitates bridging the gap between formal music education and the professional music world.

This year marks a milestone for the project, as the NYC will, for the first time, include a tour as part of their programme. On May 19, after only one week of residency at ABC in Moncton, the choir will travel to Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, returning to New Brunswick to participate in Podium East, the biennial national conference of the ACCC. In addition to their public performances, the NYC will provide special music at two Moncton churches during their stay in that city. Five school concerts have also been included as part of their tour itinerary.



WAYNE RIDDELL has been described by many as "a choral trainer of genius'. He has established a reputation as one of Canada's distinguished musicians who instils in those who sing under his direction a consistent sense of ensemble and musicality which have been hailed by the most demanding of audiences and charmed the most difficult of critics. His drive, personal discipline and sense of humour are reflected in the respect and devotion of all who have worked with him. As well as being the founding-director of the Tudor Singers, Mr Riddell was the Choral Master for the Montreal Symphony Orchestra and the Director of Music for the Church of St. Andrew and St. Paul in Montreal for over twenty years. He is currently much in demand as a free lance choral director, workshop leader and adjudicator.



PAUL HELMER, a native of Kirkland Lake, Ontario, has pursued musical studies in Toronto, Stuttgart, Berlin, and Vienna. He holds a Ph. D. in historical musicology from Columbia University in New York and is currently an associate professor at McGill University in Montreal. Well known and highly regarded as a concert performer and recording artist, Paul Helmer has been heard frequently on both the CBC radio and television networks. As an accompanist he has taken part in numerous chamber music recitals, among others, with Steven Staryk, Julius Baker, Otto Armin, the Orford Quartet and the Tudor Singers.
